Dear Friends,

We are proud to present our 2022 Annual Report, which showcases the life-changing work of our Fountain Gate Foundation in the areas we work and Tanzania in general and the impact of generous support from individual philanthropists, foundations, corporations and governments.

2022 was the best of times as our FGF helped more people, to greater effect, than ever before in its history. Internal and external assessments reflect growing confidence in the consistent quality of our work, as well as outstanding examples of excellence. We are highly motivated to grow and 2022 mark the rapid growth of our foundation. We were able to open TWO foundation branches in Morogoro and Dar Es Salaam, recruiting volunteers who are also motivated to work with us.

With the support from our donors, staffs and friends of the foundation we have risen to meet community pressing issues, helping children and marginalized children meet their needs and grow their talents. 2022 was the year of donations to the charities in orphan centers, elder keeping centers, special schools of disabled people and discovering and helping abandoned children. 2022 FGF made a full education sponsorship to 34 abandoned, displaced and abused pupils and students. **We are trying to be a good soil as it is in Mark 4:8** *"Sti ll other seed fell on good soil. It came up, grew and produced a crop, some multiplying thirty, some sixty, some a hundred times."*

In our roles we are constantly reminded that it is the people we help who teach us our most valuable lessons: moral courage, perseverance and hope in the face of hardships. We believe each of us in a community has the right to lead a meaningful life, free from poverty, abandonment and oppression and we work hard to bring us closer to that ideal. Thanks to our staffs and volunteers for having positive minds, attitudes and a helping hearts to reach marginalized communities, children, local poor communities, disabled people, elders and all people who needed our support.

We have a story of a genius child, Charles Mathias Kaloli, a mathematician who was discovered from deep rural area of Morogoro, taken and supported by our Foundation to nurture his learning ability and talent. A story of courageous boy, Christopher who lost all of his legs but now he is a president at his school, leading more than 2000 pupils. We have a young lady Mary Aron who was abandoned by her father and now she is a star football player in Laliga academy in Spain. This is why we do what we do so that Charles, Christopher, Mary and thousands of children like them will have a chance to show and develop what they have.

We are open for any positive partnership and project collaboration, donation and support to us and our children we are sponsoring and marginalized communities we are working with. Again, we are still young and eager to grow and become one of the leading foundation in Tanzania in meeting social, economic, psychological and education needs of children, youth and marginalized communities we serve. INTRODUCTION

Fountain Gate Foundation is a registered NGO working in Tanzania to promote education and health facilities to children and youth regardless of their statuses. Currently FGF is head quartered at UN Street, behind UN Dodoma offices, nearby *Makazi ya Waziri Mkuu*, Miyuji ward, Dodoma Region with branches in Dar Es Salaam and Morogoro.

The vision of the foundation is envisioning children regardless of their status to receive proper education and health services and we are working to ensure that provision of education and health services to children regardless their status is priority by generating resources through fundraising and partnership to make an impact to the community.

The foundation was established in 2019 and registered in 2021. Since its establishment, the foundation has executed a number of projects promoting health, education and children/youth talents where children and youth communities are the beneficiaries by 90%. These projects fall under three main categories as follows: -

- i. Education and talents projects 56%
- ii. Community livelihood projects 28%
- iii. Health relating projects 16%

The Foundation works directly with local communities, youth, pupils and students in schools and post school children and it is from this intervention that all the school environments are well known to the foundation, from rural to urban schooling environments.

Fountain Gate Foundation is under the leadership of philanthropist and businessman Japheth Makau who is a chairman of the foundation. He has donated all foundation's operation expenses by 100% and 56% of all our charity donations to centers in need and families in emergencies in 2022.



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PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION REPORT

EDUCATION AND TALENT PROGRAMS

In 2022 FGF has executed a number of Education and Talent related projects. These projects are:

Kipaji shule, education with talents Project

2022 marked the successful discoveries of rural talents from children and pupils through our Kipaji shule project. We trained hundreds of students in Kilosa district on how to do better in their education carriers. Several academic competitions were held to identify best pupils for close monitoring and academic support. This project led to 5 pupils to get a chance to have full education sponsorship. Others were donated with education materials and promising to do better in their education.

School Materials Support

2022 we termed the year of FGF donations to charities with education statuses, donating thousands of school materials to special schools of pupils with disabilities. Thanks to our president, friends of FGF, staffs and volunteers for donating and organizing donation and fundraising events in all of our branches in Dodoma, Morogoro and Dar Es Salaam. Each FGF branch had monthly charity event organizing trips to visit charities within their regions.

Youth Capacity Building and Vocational Training

2022 had a series of capacity building seminars and training. FOUR seminar and training sessions were conducted. Our vocational skills learning, YETS and GETS programs reached a total of 200 youth (120 AGYW and 80 boys) where they learn technical skills (vocational training) in various fields of their choices. Thanks to our partner JEFF Solutions company, who employed tens of our program beneficiaries who graduated from the programs.

School Charity Clubs

In 2022 marked the beginning of establishments of charity clubs in schools. The program has a great achievement in its first year of the initiative. A total of THREE school charity clubs were established. The idea is to prepare young pupils and students to develop a heart of helping and caring for the needy. There was a positive reception from all school teachers in those schools, and each established club has one teacher as a mentor and club guardian.

HEALTH PROJECTS

2022 we made more health relating projects than in 2020 and 2021. Thanks to our RED CROSS, Plan International and Fountain Dodoma Center of First Aid support for partnering with us in health relating projects. We had several health programs like;

- i. Health and hygiene where we made a domestic health awareness, provision of sanitary towels to poor AGYW at homes and schools, provision of cleaning facilities such as brooms, dustbins together with making a fumigation to orphanages, special schools of disabled children and elder keeping houses. Thanks to MDAU company for cooperating with us by providing professional fumigators who worked with us in this.
- ii. Adolescence sexual Reproductive health (ASRH) training to AGYW working with Fountain Gate Networks. We made FOUR training to AGYW in sports and 1200 participants of GETS programs.
- iii. Medical support. FGF made several medical support to people in need. The foundation donated medical equipment to disabled children. 2 Artificial legs, wheel chairs and other medical supply were donated including donating medical supply to CHESHAYA center of mental disabled children. Thanks to Hon Antony Mavunde (MP) for facilitating artificial legs.
- iv. Don't touch program: 2022 the foundation conducted a DON'T TOUCH ME program to create awareness to children especially school children on SEXUAL ABUSE, scope and avoiding early signs of all kinds of sexual abuses.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH THROUGH RADIO AND TV PROGRAMS

FGF made a radio and TV education and mass awareness programs using local radios and partner TV within Fountain Gate networks a Fountain Gate Television (FG-Tv). We made a TV and radio programs like Health and Hygiene, *Malezi ya Watoto*, Scope of modern Slavery and entrepreneurship. More than 1.2 Million people reached through this channel.

FGF STAFF DEVELOPMENT

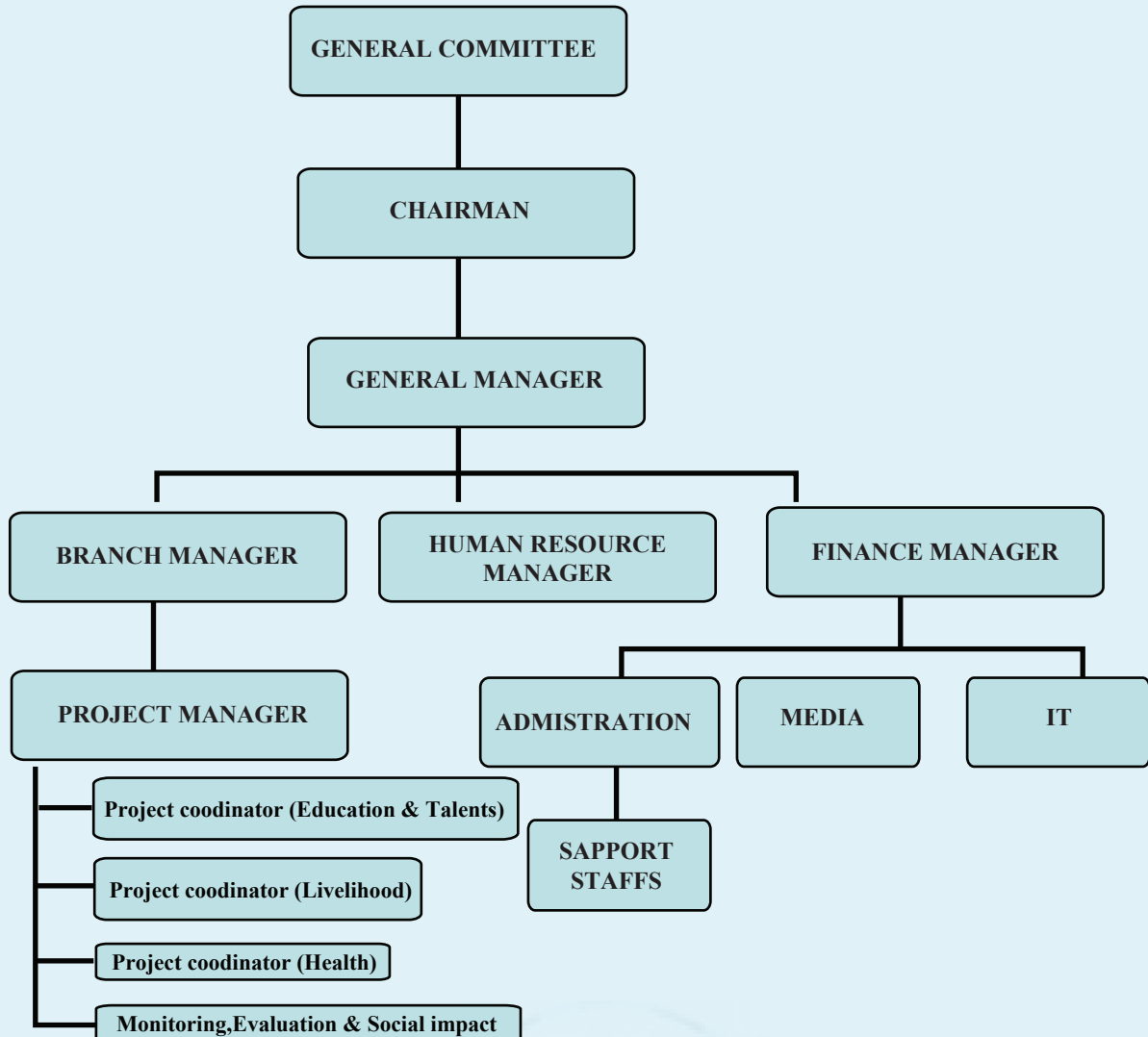

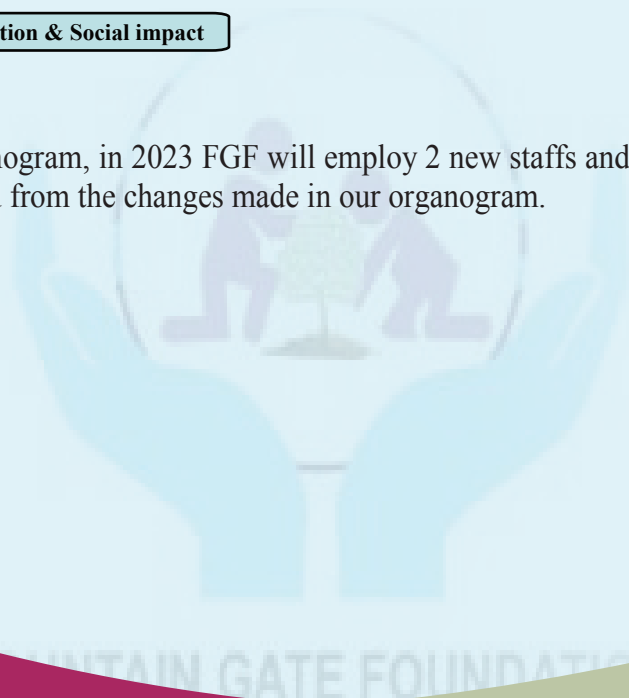
CHANGES MADE IN 2022

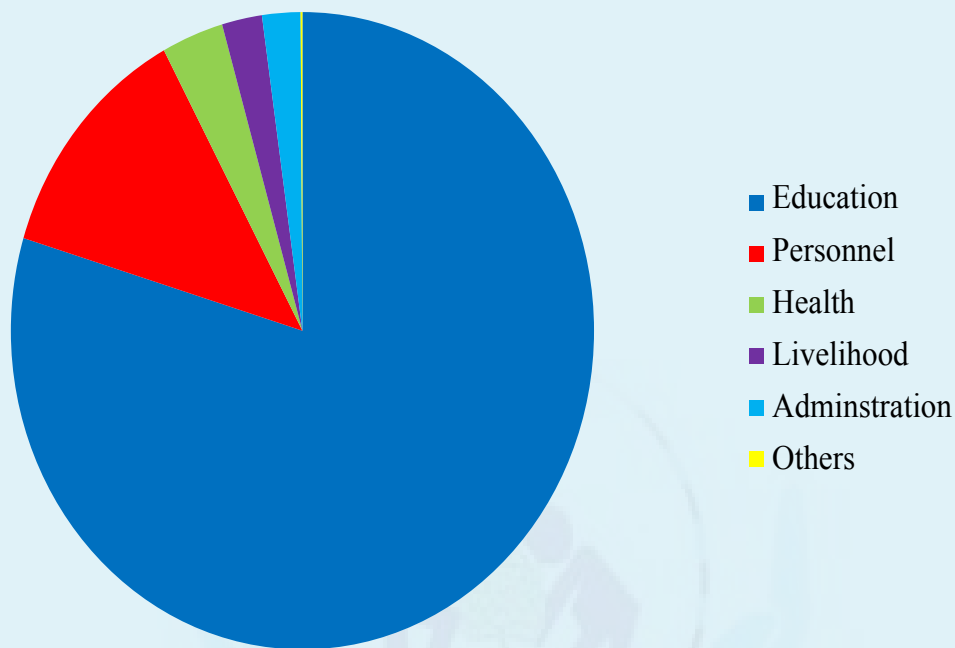

Teaching generosity by encouraging giving

It is said that charity begins at home, which means one must think of those who are close to them first before going out to assist the ones in a distant place; this implies that there must be an inbuilt quest to help the needy in one's neighborhood.

Every year Fountain Gate Primary and Secondary School in Dodoma marks a charity day that sees the school show love, compassion and care for the needy by giving them different requirements.

All students, from kindergarten, primary and secondary school donate food, clothes, soap and other necessities to Jumba la Matumaini Orphanage Center and Miyuji Cheshire Home, which nurtures children with mental disabilities.

Young Citizen interviewed children on the importance of giving.

Camilla Massawe 12, a Grade Six pupil says giving is very good because it helps people understand the existence of the needy such as children living in orphanages.

"Doing charity work is a blessing from God. It makes children understand the importance of helping less privileged children who don't have parents or relatives to look after them," Camilla says.

It's very important to love others as we do ourselves, adds Camilla. This should begin in our homes all the way to school and in society at large. "We need to encourage parents to visit these children for they will feel loved, and secondly it will be an opportunity for us to give them the help that they need such as clothing and food.



Camilla advises others to give clothes, shoes and sports gears that they are no longer using to poor children, even those who are living on the streets.

Fountain Gate Foundation Manager, Janeth Chiganga says every year Fountain Gate organises a Charity Day with the aim of teaching children empathy and charity.

"We teach this spirit to the children so they will learn from a young age that they can make positive change in society. Children need to grow up with appreciation of what they have."

MBUNGE wa Jimbo la Dodoma, Anthony Mavunde, amemkabidhi katika Shule ya Fountain Gate Academy mtoto Christopher Alex (10), aliyekakwa miguu hivi karibuni baada ya kuugua ugonjwa wa ajabu ili atimize ndoto zake kielimu.

Juni 11, mwaka jana, Christopher alpatwa na maradhi hayo baada ya kufanyiwa tohara akiwa katika Shule ya Msingi Mtita iliyo yoko wilayani Bahi.

Kutokana na hali hiyo, madaktari wa Hospitali ya Benjamin Mkapa walishauri mtoto huyo akatwe miguu baada ya kubaini hataweza kutembea kutokana na kuharibika.

Akimkabidhi shuleni hapo jana, Mavunde ambaye pia ni Naibu Waziri, Ofisi ya Waziri Mkuu, Kazi, Ajira na Vijana, alisema ameamua kumsaidia mtoto huyo, ili aweze kutimiza ndoto zake kutokana na wazazi wake kutokuwa na uwezo wa kumhudumia kwenye hali ya ulemavu.

"Baada ya kufanyiwa upasuaji, wazazi wa Christopher walionekana kukata tamaa na wakaona ni mwisho wa maisha ya mtoto huyo, upande wa shule na kijamii kushirikiana na wenzake," alisema.

Alisema mtoto huyo amepatiwa miguu bandia na amemfanya kama sehemu ya familia yake kwa kumsomesha kwenye shule hiyo.

"Ile ndoto yake ya kupata elimu imetimia, tumemtoa Wilaya ya Bahi na wazazi wame-

kubali aje asome katika shule hii kubwa hapa Dodoma ya Fountain Gate, ambayo Mkurugenzi wake alionyesha utayari wa kumpokea katika shule ambayo kwa kweli inafanya vizuri na miundombinu yake ni rafiki kwa Christopher," alisema.

Mavunde alisema mkurugenzi wa shule hiyo, ameamua kutoa mchango wake kwa kukubali mtoto huyo asome kwenye shule yake.

"Nitoe rai kwa Watanzania kwasaidie watoto wenye mahitaji kama Christopher, kwa kuwa ni sehemu ya shukrani kwa Mungu, nashukuru sana uongozi wa shule kwa kumpokea na kuanza masomo, tumelazimika kumrudisha darasa moja nyuma ili awe na uwezo kama wenzake," alisema.

Mkurugenzi wa shule

hiyo, Japhet Makau, alisema wameamua kumpokea kutokana na kumpa nafasi mbunge huyo kuleta watoto atakaona wana mahitaji maalum kama Christopher ili watimize ndoto zao.

"Shule hii kwa sasa makao makuu yake yako Dar es Salaam, lakini tumeamua kuja Dodoma kwa sababu ni makao makuu ya nchi na kuna mahitaji mengi, hii ni miongoni mwa shule tano bora kwa Dar es Salaam, kusomesha watoto wenye mahitaji maalum ni azima yetu na kwa sasa tuna watoto yatima 20 na kila mwaka tunapokea wenye mahitaji maalum," alisema.

Naye mtoto Christopher alimshukuru Mavunde kwa kutimiza ndoto yake na kuahidi kusoma kwa bidii, ili baadaye aweze kuwa mwalimu.



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
